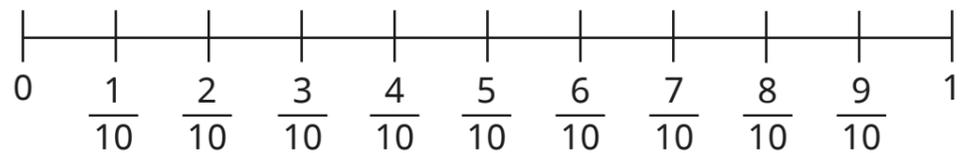
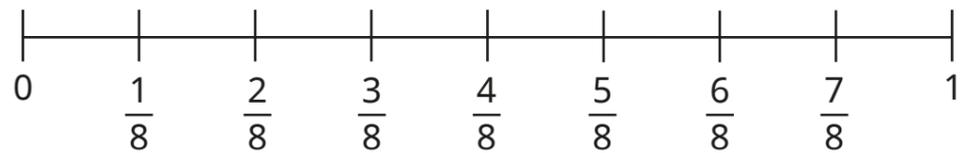
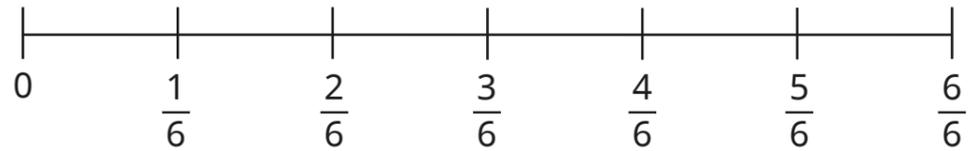
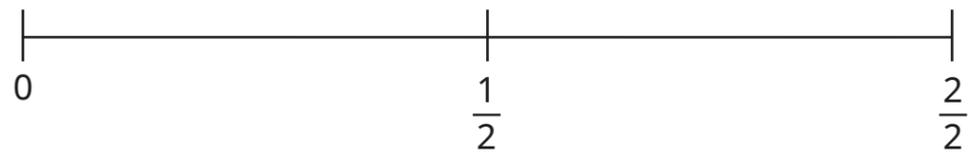


Equivalent fractions on a number line

a) $\frac{1}{2}$ is equivalent to $\frac{\square}{6}$

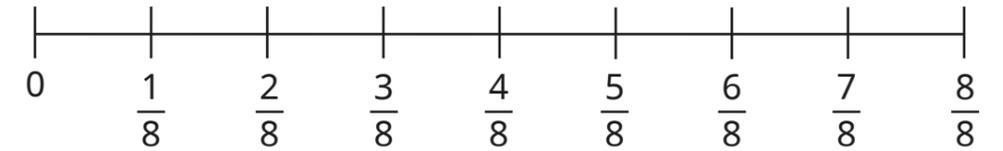
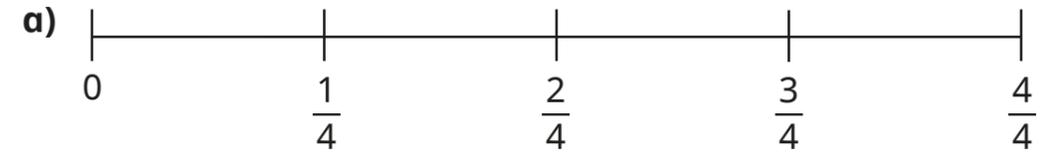
